Where is the Trades Hall? Well, the phone book says 126 Vivian Street, which is to the south of the main shopping area three blocks up Cuba street from Jame's Smith's corner then turn left. If you are coming from the east, then proceed from the Taj Mahal along Courtenay Place to Taranaki St

turn left and the second street on the right is Vivian. If you have found the St George, walk along Manners St to Jame's Smith's corner then follow the above directions. If you are coming from out of town get a number 11 bus from the Railway Station and ask to be thrown out at the corner of Cuba and Vivian.

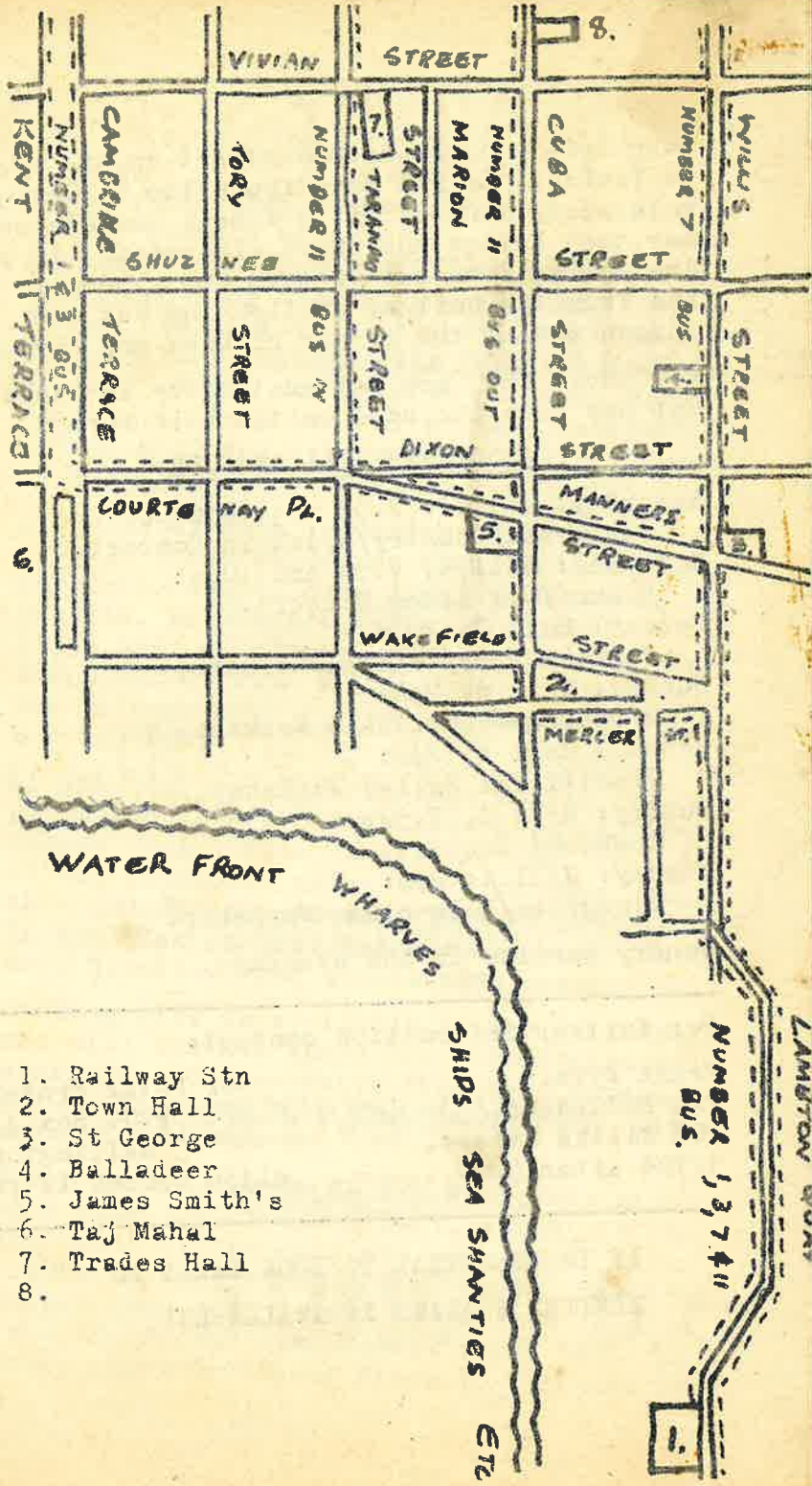
