

- F39: Throughout the day a chance for those interested in Contemporary music to meet, talk, swap ideas, play records, tapes, rehearse, yak, etc.
- G41: Traditionalists will be able to listen to lots of records, talk, sing and consume with the chance to meet our special guests, Declan Affley (if he's not in the pub) and A.L. Lloyd!
- G43: The place for Country musicians and followers to meet and be heard throughout the day and a chance for the beginner to 'pick-the-brains' of some leading musicians.
- G46: The meeting place for enthusiasts of the Blues where records may be played, dicussions on the many aspects of the Blues can take place and to hold spontaneous performances.

Cafeteria

The Cafeteria will be open each day to serve noon and evening meals. Before noon and during the afternoon light refreshments will be available.

The Caf. will contain the Information Centre, storage for instruments and be a general meeting-point. If at any time you wish to know what's on and where consult the information centre. The centre will handle full registrations only until 2 pm Saturday; after which only one-day registrations will be available.

Meals

Meals will be served from 12 to 2pm and from 5 - 7pm on Saturday and Sunday; though on Sunday meals will be available from 11am. On Monday lunch will be served from 12 - 2pm.

Instruments

Rooms
