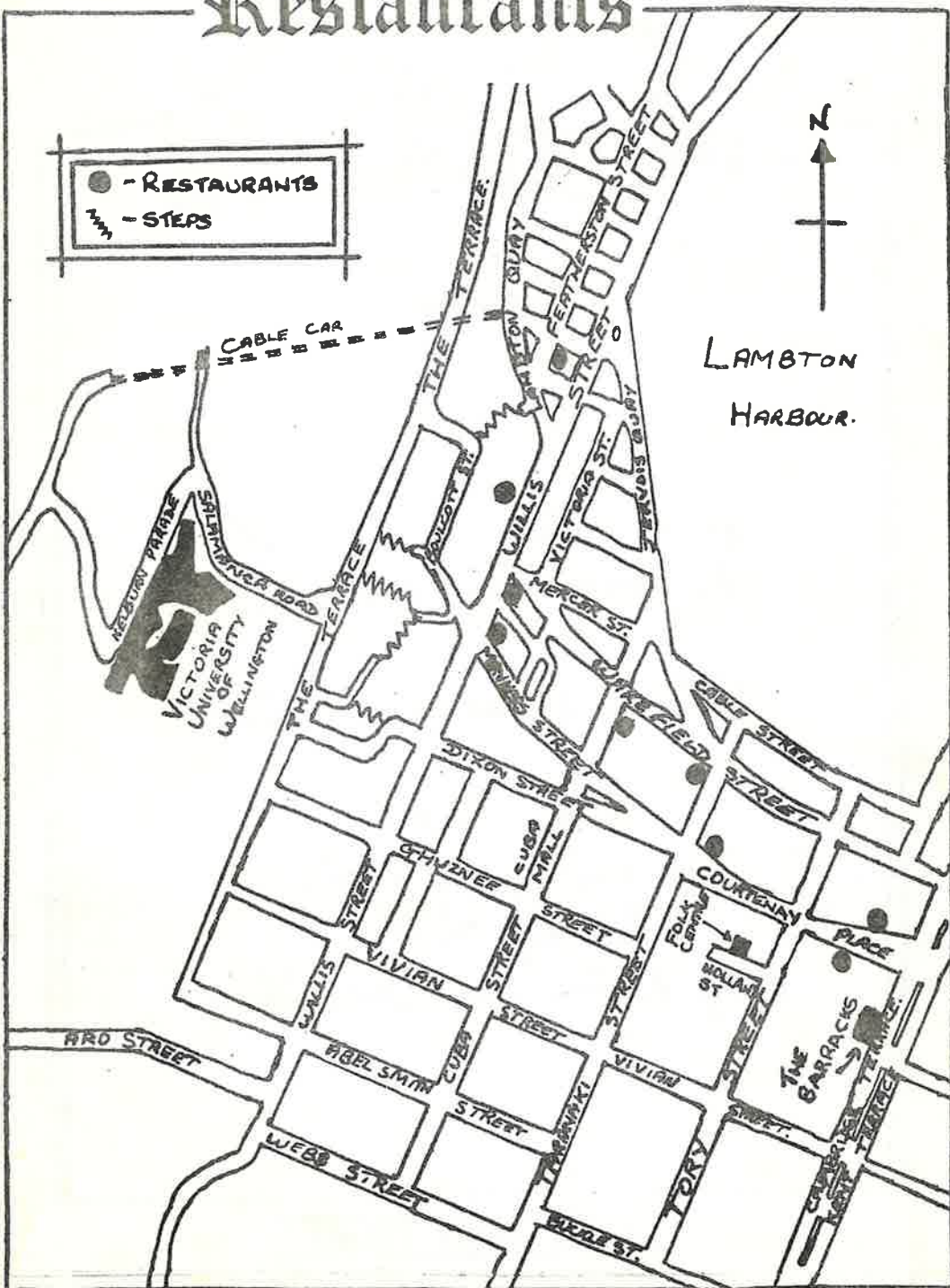
## Catering Arrangements
